Liberal Democrats are celebrating a historic vote which saw Surrey Heath Borough Council Tories losing a vote for the first time in council history. The vote concerned a Lib Dem motion designed to put a stop to the decision made by the Council's Standards Committee to sue the Standards Board for England, after it reported that eight serving Tory Councillors had brought their office or authority into disrepute.

Cllr David Whitcroft told Focus, **"This vote will stop the Tories pursuing a judicial review and will save the council taxpayers in Surrey Heath the huge legal fees which otherwise would have been wasted."**

The Council also passed a motion criticising the Conservative Council Leader, for supporting the expenditure required to seek legal advice about going to the High Court.

## RESIDENTS SURVEY - FEEDBACK

The post bag of local Liberal Democrat campaigner Rosalyn Harper is bulging with responses to the party's 2004 Surrey Heath residents' survey. Local residents were asked 50 questions on key issues in a survey delivered door-to-door over the last few months. Labour are closing one third of sub-post offices.

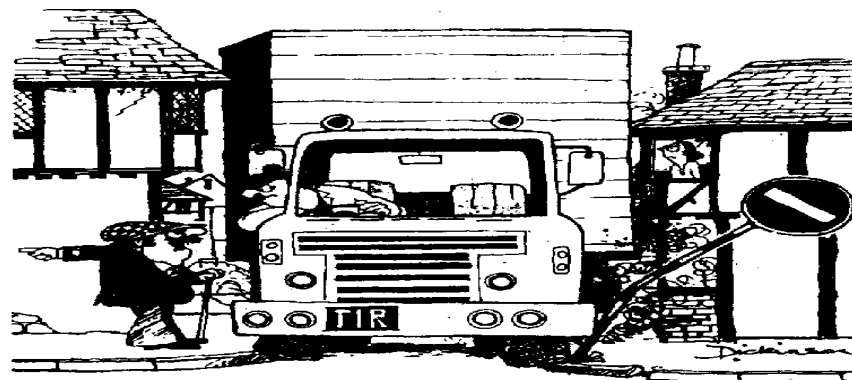

## Keep Lorries out of Windlesham

Windlesham Lib Dems are campaigning to keep large heavy lorries out of the village. They are suggesting a weight limit of 7.5 tonnes in Updown Hill and Chertsey Road for all through traffic. This would not affect delivery lorries needing access to local businesses.



Lib Dem Councillor David Crew, who lives in Chertsey Road, said large vehicles using the village as a rat-run only caused problems for other road users. He told Focus, **"There is absolutely no need for these juggernauts to come through the village. There are plenty of alternative routes to all the nearby villages, and long-distance traffic should be using the M3 or the A30."**

Fellow parish councillor and former Chairman of Windlesham Parish Council, Meurig Williams, agreed, saying, **"These large vehicles often speed along our narrow roads and are a menace to pedestrians, including children on their way to school."**

The Register of Interests for Surrey Heath Lib Dem Councillors has been published on our Surrey Heath website. This followed a decision by Tory Councillors on Surrey Heath's Standards Committee, who refused to back a Lib Dem initiative to put this information for all Councillors up on the Council's own website! The Register of Interests is a list of the financial (and other) interests of all councillors, and is by law available for inspection by any member of the public.

Lib Dem Councillor Duncan Clark told Focus: *"This is a farcical position. Every resident has the right to see this register. We believe in openness on this and similar matters, and have therefore decided to publish this information on our own website."*

## 'Sleaze' - Is it all in the past?

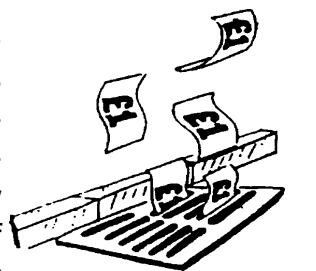
Conservative MP Nick Hawkins does not seem to think so .....

Nick Hawkins launched a stinging attack in the House of Commons on his own Surrey Heath Tory Constituency Party, in which he claimed the party had demanded money from him in exchange for providing the sort of support services which most constituency parties would provide for nothing. He also told the House of Commons that the dispute between him and his local party **'revolves around power, money, ambitions, jealousy and greed of a tiny handful of people.'**

He attacked one constituency Official, in particular, claiming that, **'Ever since [Mr Hawkin's selection as Surrey Heath Candidate] the Official has sought to undermine me because he saw me as a threat to his money making activities.'**

... where the Tory Leader of the Council—in response to a number of Standards Board Of England reports which were critical of some Tory Councillors — endorsed the spending of £13,500 of Council Taxpayers' money on obtaining a Barrister's Opinion on the matter.
